General Orders of a Sentry

1. To take charge of this post and all government property in view.
2. To walk my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
3. To report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
4. To repeat all calls from posts more distant from the guardhouse than my own.
5. To quit my post only when properly relieved.
6. To receive, obey, and pass on to the sentry who relieves me all orders from the Commanding Officer, Command Duty Officer, Officer of the Deck, and Officers and Petty Officers of the Watch only.
7. To talk to no one except in the line of duty.
8. To give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.
9. To call the Officer of the Deck in any case not covered by instructions.
10. To salute all officers and all colors and standards not cased.
11. To be especially watchful at night, and during the time for challenging, to challenge all persons on or near my post and to allow no one to pass without proper authority.

Sailor's Creed

I am a United States sailor. I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States of America, and I will obey the orders of those appointed over me. I represent the fighting spirit of the Navy and those who have gone before me to defend freedom and democracy around the world. I proudly serve my country's Navy combat team with honor, courage, and commitment. I am committed to excellence and the fair treatment of all.

Grooming Standards

Cadets will maintain proper grooming standards at all times.

Hair

For RT, males will have a “crew cut” or “zero.” Please see a professional barber prior to reporting. Males will shave all facial hair.

Females must have their hair in a bun, if long, or cut so that the hair does not go below the lower edge of the back of the collar. All hair pins and hair ties will match the cadet’s hair color as closely as possible. Scrunchies and hair nets are not authorized. Hair may be dyed, but must be in one natural color.

Jewelry

Males or females may wear one ring per hand. While one small necklace is authorized, we encourage cadets to leave their jewelry at home as it may get in the way of training activities or be lost.

Females may wear one set of silver ball earrings in the lowest hole on their ears. No other piercing is authorized.

Black watches are authorized.

Fingernails

Fingernails must be clipped short and kept clean. Nail polish is not authorized at RT.
