Sponsorship Letter

The Naval Sea Cadet and League Cadet Corps are for American youth ages 10-17 that have a desire to learn about the Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Merchant Marine. The objectives of the Sea Cadet program are to introduce youth to naval life, to develop in them a sense of pride, patriotism, courage, and self-reliance, and to maintain an environment free of drugs, alcohol and gangs.

Sea Cadets are authorized by the Secretary of the Navy to wear Navy uniforms appropriately marked with the Sea Cadet Corps insignia. Our cadets meet or “drill” twice per month in Lake City, FL. We also host drills at nearby military bases, operational support centers and with other NSCC/NLCC units.

Our unit is organized as a Divisions, which closely reflects the surface Navy. Some units are organized as Squadrons, which are geared towards the field of naval aviation, and battalions, which reflect Navy construction battalions (Seabees). Whether a division, squadron, or battalion, our local unit has one main purpose: to foster teamwork, camaraderie and an understanding of the military command structure.

Our cadets are instructed by both Sea Cadet Officers, active duty military and senior cadets through classroom and applied instruction in subjects such as basic seamanship, military drill, and leadership.

Our unit also participates in Sea Cadet regional weekend competitions where units compete with each other to test their seamanship and military skills. Community events such as parades, fairs and air shows are venues in which The Liberty Division also involves itself.

The Sea Cadet training program consists of Navy Non-Resident Training Courses (NRTC), two-week training schools, shipboard training, and training arranged locally by units. NRTC cover basic military and naval subjects such as naval history, seamanship, leadership, and ship/aircraft familiarization.

Two-week training (TWT) mostly takes place during summer months and occasionally during winter and spring break. The first TWT for all cadets is NSCC/NLCC Recruit Training, better known as boot camp. It is a scaled down version of the Navy’s boot camp. For the two-week period, cadets are instructed by active and reserve military personnel and Sea Cadet officers in military drill and discipline, physical fitness, seamanship, shipboard safety, first aid, naval history, and leadership. After cadets have successfully completed boot camp, they can then participate in advanced training. Sea Cadet advanced training currently consists of the following:

Sea Cadet training is held throughout the continental United States, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and Guam on military installations.

The Liberty Division currently has 20 cadets with a charter to grow to 40 plus cadets, and maintains an annual operating expense of over \$4,000 per year with costs increasing with each new enrollment. The majority of these fees currently are being paid from the Cadet's family directly. It typically costs a family up to \$1,000 to have a cadet in the program per year which includes uniform costs, annual membership and travel expenses along with basic and advanced training costs. While we drill in Lake City, FL, our cadets travel from Mayo, Branford, Trenton, Bell, Alachua, High Springs, Fort White.

Our goal with this sponsorship program is to raise funding for our cadet renewals. These funds go directly to our cadets renewal fund and is only accessible by the cadets that have completed their first year of training successfully, meet our attendance requirements (80% Drill Participation), volunteer for at least 50% of our fundraisers, and show a desire to continue their training. Without this type of funding many of our cadets are unable to continue the program after the first year.
